ATC 150 Clinical Practice I

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: ATC-110, ATC-112, ATC 115 and ATC 210

Corequisites: ATC 215- must be taken either prior to or at the same time as this course

Offered

Course description: This course provides entry-level clinical experience. Emphasis is placed on basic anesthesia care in efficient ambulatory surgery anesthesia and similar settings. Upon completion, students should be able to provide anesthesia support and demonstrate clinical competence in required performance evaluations.

Course Clinical Hours per week: 9. Semester Hours Credit, 4.
