# **EPT-150 Incident Management**

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Course description. This course introduces the National Incident Management System (NIMS). Topics include integrating command and control systems, maintaining communication within command-and-control systems, and using NIMS procedures. Upon completion, students should demonstrate knowledge of key concepts necessary for operating within the National Incident Management System.
