

MED 122 Medical Terminology II

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: MED 121

Corequisites: None

Course description. This course is the second in a series of medical terminology courses. Topics include medical vocabulary and the terms that relate to the anatomy, physiology, pathological conditions, and treatment of selected systems. Upon completion, students should be able to pronounce, spell, and define medical terms as related to selected body systems and their pathological disorders.

Course Hours per Week: Class, 3. Semester Hours Credit, 3.

1. Analyze, pronounce, and spell medical word roots, prefixes, and suffixes.
2. Define medical abbreviations common to anatomical and physiological terminology.

5. Explain the meaning of surgical terms related to the lymphatic and immune systems.
